### Christians aren't perfect, just forgiven

Matthew 5:48 (NASB<sub>1995</sub>) "Therefore you are to be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

**Hebrews 10:14 (NKJV)** For by one offering He has perfected forever those who are being sanctified.

Christians are forgiven, delivered from the kingdom of darkness into the kingdom of light, recipients of eternal life through Jesus' resurrection, and indwelled by the Holy Spirit (whose sanctifying power convicts us of our sin, guides us into truth, and transforms us into the image of Christ – who is perfect)

1 John 1:6-9 (ESV) <sup>6</sup> If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. <sup>7</sup> But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. <sup>8</sup> If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup> If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

If you don't have the Holy Spirit, do you realize you can't abide in Jesus?

1 John 2:3-6 (NKJV) <sup>3</sup> Now by this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments. <sup>4</sup> He who says, "I know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him. <sup>5</sup> But whoever keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him. By this we know that we are in Him. <sup>6</sup> He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked.

## OK, but what does all that have to do with knowing & defending biblical morality, & transformation?

This: When Jesus meets the lost, He directs them & desires that the lost <u>are found</u> in <u>Him</u> & leave sin behind.

Saul's (Paul's) transformation after his encounter with Jesus

Galatians 5:16-24 (HCSB) 16 I say then, walk by the Spirit and you will not carry out the desire of the flesh. 17 For the flesh desires what is against the Spirit, and the Spirit desires what is against the flesh; these are opposed to each other, so that you don't do what you want. 18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. 19 Now the works of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, moral impurity, promiscuity, <sup>20</sup> idolatry, sorcery, hatreds, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambitions, dissensions, factions, <sup>21</sup> envy, drunkenness, carousing, and anything similar. I tell you about these things in advance - as I told you before - that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faith, <sup>23</sup> gentleness, selfcontrol. Against such things there is no law. 24 Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. prassó ( $\pi
