knowing and Defending Jesus (Yeshua) as the Promised, Jewish Messiah (Part 3)

Jesus is highly exalted & sprinkles the nations

Isaiah 52:13-15 (NASB1995) ¹³ Behold, My servant will prosper, He will be high and lifted up and greatly exalted. 14 Just as many were astonished at you, My people, So His appearance was marred more than any man And His form more than the sons of men. ¹⁵ Thus He will sprinkle many nations, Kings will shut their mouths on account of Him; For what had not been told them they will see, And what they had not heard they will understand.

Philippians 2:9 (ESV) ⁹ Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name,

Hebrews 10:21-22 (ESV) ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.

Jesus experienced suffering and rejection

Isaiah 53:1-3 (NIV) ¹ Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? 2 He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. ³ He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.

John 1:10-11 (NIV) ¹⁰
He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. ¹¹ He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him.

Matthew 26:56b (NKJV)
Then all the disciples
forsook Him and fled.

Even though we don't deserve it, our sins are placed on Him

Isaiah 53:4-6 (NIV) 4 Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted. ⁵ But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed. 6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

Romans 5:6-8 (ESV)

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. For one will scarcely die for a righteous person though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die—⁸ but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Jesus remained silent amid severe oppression

Isaiah 53:7 (HCSB) He was oppressed and afflicted, yet He did not open His mouth. Like a lamb and like a sheep silent before her shearers, He did not open His mouth.

Mark 14:60-61a (NASB1995) 60 The high priest stood up *and came* forward and questioned Jesus, saying, "Do You not answer? What is it that these men are testifying against You?" 61 But He kept silent and did not answer.

led to the slaughter Matthew 27:12-14 (ESV) 12 But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he gave no answer. 13 Then Pilate said to him, "Do you not hear how many things they testify against you?" But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the governor was greatly amazed.

Jesus' tomb was to be with sinners and the rich

Isaiah 53:8-9 (HCSB) 8 He was taken away because of oppression and judgment; and who considered His fate? For He was cut off from the land of the living; He was struck because of my people's rebellion. ⁹ They made His grave with the wicked and with a rich man at His death, although He had done no violence and had not spoken deceitfully.

Matthew 27:57-60 (NKJV) 57 Now when evening had come, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who himself had also become a disciple of Jesus. 58 This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be given to him. 59 When Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, 60 and laid it in his new tomb which he had hewn out of the rock; and he rolled a large stone against the door of the tomb, and departed.

It was God's will for Jesus to take on our sin

Isaiah 53:10-11 (ESV) 10 **Yet it was** the will of the LORD to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the LORD shall prosper in his hand. 11 Out of the anguish of his soul he shall see and be satisfied; by his knowledge shall the righteous one, my servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities.

Mark 14:36 (NASB1995) And He was saying, "Abba! Father! All things are possible for You; remove this cup from Me; yet not what I will, but what You will."

2 Corinthians 5:21 (HCSB)

21 He made the One who did
not know sin to be sin for us, so
that we might become the
righteousness of God in Him.

When we follow Christ, He mediates and intercedes for us

Isaiah 53:12 (ESV)

¹² Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

Hebrews 7:21-25 (NIV) 21 but he became a priest with an oath when God said to him: "The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind: 'You are a priest forever.' " 22 Because of this oath, Jesus has become the guarantor of a better covenant. 23 Now there have been many of those priests, since death prevented them from continuing in office; ²⁴ but because Jesus lives forever, he has a permanent priesthood. ²⁵ Therefore he is able to save completely those who come to God through him, because he always lives to intercede for them.
