







He was Perfectly Obedient in His Suffering

Leading up to Mark 15:1...

Jesus cleanses the temple twice in His ministry

Jesus loves sinners to repentance & rebukes the Jewish authorities

Jesus tells His disciples of His coming death & resurrection

Jesus proves He is our Passover with His triumphal entry (10th of Abib/ Nisan) & through the last supper, explains His fulfillment

Jesus suffers in the garden, is arrested, falsely accused, & abused

Jesus confirms He is the Messiah & the Son of God, while Peter denies Jesus 3 times, & then weeps bitterly

Mark 15:1-5 (NKJV) 1 Immediately, in the morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council; and they bound Jesus, led *Him* away, and delivered *Him* to Pilate. ² Then Pilate asked Him, "Are You the King of the Jews?" He answered and said to him, "It is as you say." 3 And the chief priests accused Him of many things, but He answered nothing. 4 Then Pilate asked Him again saying, "Do You answer nothing? Mark 15:6-11 (ESV) 6 Now at the feast he used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. ⁷ And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man called Barabbas. 8 And the crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do as he usually did for them. 9 And he answered them, saying, "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?" 10 For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered him up. 11 But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them Barabbas Jesus was not only about to fulfill Passover, linstead. Mark 15:12-18 (NASB₁₉₉₅) ¹² Answering again, Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Him whom you call the King of the Jews?" ¹³ They shouted back. "Crucify Him!" ¹⁴ But Pilate said to them. "Why. Will you hail Him as the true King, Lord and Savior? Will you be willing to share in the suffering for His name?

after having Jesus scourged, he handed Him over to be crucified.

The soldiers took Him away into the palace (that is, the Praetorium), and they called together the whole *Roman* cohort. ¹⁷ They dressed Him up in purple, and after twisting a crown of thorns, they put it on Him; ¹⁸ and they began to acclaim Him, "Hail, King of the Jews!"

We learn from John's gospel that it appears Pilate scourged Jesus as a last attempt for the people to show mercy toward Jesus but to no avail.

Unaware, the soldiers mocked and abused the One who was actually the King of ALL kings and the very One who created everything, incl. them!
